Low-Voltage Cable Trays

Low-voltage cable trays are designed for signal, control, and data transmission cables, typically operating at voltages up to 50 volts . They are commonly used in telecommunications, computer networking, security systems, and instrumentation. These trays are generally smaller, lighter, and more flexible, reflecting the lower power requirements of the cables they carry . Proper installation ensures signal integrity and minimal electromagnetic interference (EMI), often requiring separation from high-voltage trays or the use of dividers when space is limited .

High-Voltage Cable Trays

High-voltage cable trays are built to carry power cables that handle high electrical loads, often in the thousands of volts, such as those used in industrial plants, power stations, or large-scale electrical distribution systems . These trays are heavier, more robust, and designed for heat dissipation, as high-voltage cables generate significant heat during operation . Installation must consider adequate spacing, ventilation, and secure fastening to maintain safety and system reliability
