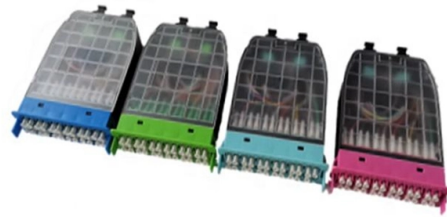


Distance between high-voltage cable trays and power cable trays



Article Overview

High-voltage power cable trays should generally maintain a minimum horizontal separation of 0.5 meters from signal or low-voltage trays, with vertical spacing of at least 150 millimeters to reduce EMI and allow safe maintenance.

Horizontal Separation

For parallel runs, power and signal/control cable trays should be separated by at least 0.5 meters (50 cm) to minimize electromagnetic interference (EMI) and maintain signal integrity . If the trays are shielded, this distance can be reduced to 0.3 meters because shielding helps contain EMI . When high-voltage power trays are installed alongside other power trays, a minimum horizontal spacing of 0.6 meters is recommended to allow maintenance access, inspection, and proper airflow for heat dissipation .

Vertical Separation

When trays are stacked vertically, the minimum clearance between floor-mounted or upper/lower trays should be 150 millimeters (15 cm). This spacing prevents cable interference, allows for future expansion, and ensures adequate ventilation and cooling . In industrial layouts, it is common to place electrical (power) trays above instrumentation or control trays, which further reduces EMI risks .
