

Function of Fiber Optic Cold Splice Terminal Connector



Overview

Optical fiber cold splice technology is based on the use of mechanical connectors to join two fiber-optic cables. The connectors used in cold. Fiber optic joints or terminations - where cables are terminated - are made two ways: 1) connectors that mate two fibers to create a temporary joint and/or connect the fiber to a piece of network gear (left) or 2) splices which create a permanent joint between the two fibers (right). Either joining method must have three primary characteristics. Fiber optic quick connector/cold connector The fiber optic quick connector/cold connector is a very innovative field-terminated connector, which contains factory-installed optical fiber, pre-polished ceramic ferrule and a mechanical splicing mechanism. According to the different connection methods, fusion splicing can be divided into two types: "core to center method" and "fixed V-groove to center method".
