

How many volts is the circuit in a household electrical distribution box

Standard household circuits in the U.S. operate at 120 volts for general outlets and 240 volts for high-power appliances.

Standard Circuit Voltages

120 volts (V) is the most common voltage for general household circuits, powering lights, outlets, and small appliances. These circuits draw power from one hot bus bar and a neutral wire in the main electrical panel and are typically protected by 15-amp or 20-amp breakers, supporting up to 1800-2400 watts at 120V . 240 volts (V) circuits are used for high-demand appliances such as electric stoves, dryers, and HVAC systems. These circuits connect to both hot bus bars in the panel, effectively combining two 120V legs to provide 240V. Breakers for these circuits are usually 30 amps or higher, allowing appliances to draw up to 7200 watts or more .

Circuit Configuration in the Panel

The main service panel (breaker box) receives power from the utility via two 120V “hot” legs, providing a split-phase 120/240V system. Each branch circuit is connected to the bus bars:

- 120V circuits: Use one hot wire and a neutral, occupying a single slot in the panel.
- 240V circuits: Use two hot wires from opposite phases, occupying two adjacent slots in the panel . Each circuit is protected by a breaker that interrupts current in c...
