

How to weld the protective sleeve of a cap-type optical cable splice closure



Article Overview

To weld the protective sleeve of a cap-type optical cable splice closure, first prepare and clean the fibers, perform fusion splicing, then insert the splice into the protective sleeve and heat it to shrink and secure the sleeve around the splice.

Step 1: Prepare the Fiber Optic Cable

- Strip the coating: Use a wire stripper to carefully remove the protective coating from the fiber, exposing the bare fiber. The stripping length should match the sleeve and closure requirements, typically a few centimeters to over ten centimeters depending on the design ().
- Clean the fiber: Wipe the exposed fiber with alcohol cotton to remove dust, grease, or other contaminants ().
- Cut the fiber: Use a precision fiber cleaver to cut the fiber ends cleanly, ensuring flat, perpendicular surfaces to avoid signal loss ().

Step 2: Fusion Splicing

- Align the fibers: Place the prepared fiber ends into the fusion splicer fixture, ensuring proper alignment of the cores ().
- Perform the weld: Activate the fusion splicer to weld the fibers. Monitor the splicer display to confirm a high-quality splice with minimal loss ().
- Remove the fused fiber: Once welding is complete, the splicer will push out the fused fiber for sleeve installation ()....
