

Is a network cable an electrical wire or a fiber optic cable

Network cables can be either fiber optic, which transmits data as light, or electrical (copper Ethernet), which transmits data as electrical signals.

Electrical (Copper Ethernet) Cables

Electrical network cables, commonly called Ethernet cables, are made of copper wires twisted together and encased in a protective sheath. They transmit data using electrical signals and are widely used for home networks, offices, and device connectivity. Common types include Cat5e, Cat6, and Cat6a, typically supporting distances up to 100 meters and speeds up to 10 Gbps depending on the category. Copper cables are affordable, easy to install, but can be affected by electromagnetic interference from nearby devices .

Fiber Optic Cables

Fiber optic cables are made of thin strands of glass or plastic fibers that transmit data using pulses of light generated by LEDs or lasers. This allows them to carry data over much longer distances—from a few kilometers for multimode fiber to 10-20 kilometers or more for single-mode fiber—without significant signal loss. Fiber optic cables are immune to electromagnetic interference, offer higher bandwidth, and support faster data transfer rates than copper cables. They are commonly used for high-speed internet backbones, long-distance communication, and data-intensive applications
