Always avoid looking directly into fiber ends and use a fiber optic power meter to confirm no light is present before inspection. Safety glasses with side shields are essential to protect against fiber shards and accidental exposure to light . **Bare Fiber Hazards:** The cleaved ends of optical fibers are extremely sharp and can easily penetrate skin. Fiber fragments are difficult to remove once embedded and can cause infections or injuries. Proper handling includes using tweezers, magnification tools, and dedicated disposal containers for all fiber scraps. Avoid dropping fiber pieces on floors or work surfaces to prevent accidental contact or ingestion . **Chemical Exposure:** Splicing and termination often involve adhesives, cleaning agents, and other chemicals. These substances can irritate skin, eyes, or respiratory systems. Protective gloves, aprons, and proper ventilation are necessary to minimize exposure. Avoid eating or drinking near the work area to prevent ingestion of fiber particles or chemicals . **Physical and Environmental Risks:** Fiber splicing may occur in confined spaces, elevated locations, or near electrical equipment.
