The connector end plugs into equipment, patch panels, or optical distribution frames (ODFs), while the bare fiber end is designed to be permanently joined to the incoming fiber cable in the field. Pigtails are widely used because they combine the precision of factory-polished connectors with the flexibility of field splicing.

Connection Methods

1. Fusion Splicing

Fusion splicing is the most common and preferred method for connecting pigtails to optical fibers. It involves:

- Stripping the protective coating from both the pigtail and the incoming fiber.
- Cleaning the bare fibers to remove dust and debris.
- Aligning the fiber cores precisely using a fusion splicer.
- Applying a localized electric arc to melt and fuse the fibers together. This method...
