A core switch requires high-capacity hardware, modular scalability, high backplane bandwidth, and optimized routing and switching performance to serve as the backbone of a network.

Key Hardware and Module Considerations

- **Slots and Modules:** Core switches should have multiple slots to accommodate various functional and interface modules, such as LAN, WAN, SFP, and 10Gbps modules. The number of slots determines the switch's scalability and the total number of ports it can support, while module type flexibility ensures adaptability to complex network environments .
- **Port Density:** High port density is essential to aggregate traffic from multiple distribution switches efficiently. Modular switches allow flexible port configurations, while chassis switches provide the highest density for large-scale networks .

Performance Parameters

- **Backplane Bandwidth:** The backplane is the internal data bus connecting all ports and modules. A high backplane bandwidth ensures that inter-port communication occurs without bottlenecks, supporting high-speed data transfer across the network .
- **Forwarding Rate:** Core switches must handle large volumes of traffic with minimal latency. The forwarding rate, measured in packets per second, should match the expected network load to prevent congestion
